#### Safety First: Wear Helmets on Two Wheelers! - Sajid Gurjar (10-B)

Recently, wearing a helmet has been made mandatory in Pune, with an aim to lower the number of accidents and casualties. However, people are still reluctant, citing reasons like discomfort, difficulty to carry, messing the hair. But these reasons are negligible compared to your precious life!

Helmets have been in existence since the middle ages. Initially used for military, the headgear was also used for protecting players' head while playing games and safeguarding the riders of a carriage. Today, the significance of a helmets is all more germane as the roads are heavily flooded. The patch works and continuous development of Indian roads increase the chances of accidents.

Many benefits of wearing helmets: (1) effective in reducing head injuries, which could cost a life; (2) protection of eyes from dust and high beam light; (3) better attention and control of the vehicle; (4) protection from cold breeze, and cover for ears, preventing you from getting sick in the cold; and (5) lower the temperature due to the solid online cushioning in summers. You should also this wear a helmet to avoid hefty fines and spoiling your driving record.

## Unsung Hero of Independence: Matangini Hazra

Freedom fighters are the pillars behind the freedom movement. It is because of their sacrifices that we prospered into a free country. My favourite freedom fighter is MATANGINI HAZRA, the indomitable freedom fighter, who bravely took bullets right in her heart!



Born into a poor peasant family in a small village, Matangini could not get any formal education, was forced into child marriage at an early age and became a widow at just eighteen. After her husband's demise she moved back to her native village and started helping people in distress. Soon, Matangini was drawn towards

the freedom struggle and was greatly inspired by Mahatma Gandhi, earning a nickname 'Gandhi Buri' for her dedication. During Satyagraha, she once stealthily got into premises of Tamluk court and hoisted the Indian National Flag. Repeated arrests only strengthened her resolve.

Matangini Hazra showed bravery till her last breath. On Sep 29,1942, she led a procession of around 6000 towards Tamluk police station, when the police shot at her, as she shoted 'VANDE MATRAM'. She held the flag aloft as she was shot thrice, finally succumbing to her injuries with the flag in her hand.

Matangini was truly a women of unmatchable valour and grit, who inspired countless others to follow her footsteps in the fight against the British. She is 'THE UNSUNG WARRIOR' of India.
